Report of Anti-Ragging Workshop

Anti-Ragging Committee of R C Patel College of Arts, Commerce and Science, Shirpur has organized a one-day workshop for awareness students under the academic year 2023-24. Committee's report is as follows.

Ragging should not be an obstacle in the overall development of the personality of the students. A workshop organized in the college to introduce the Maharashtra Prevention of Ragging Act, 2018 in order to stop the fact that ragging not only causes academic damage to the students but often destroys one's life due to one's actions. On 26th August 2023, the workshop was started at 9.30 a.m. On this occasion, the program was chaired by the Dr. A G Sonawane, Coordinator of the Committee, and key speaker Dr. M. B. Bachute, Head, Dept. of Psychology, Workshop Co-coordinator Dr. R R Vasave, and honorable members of ragging committee were present. The workshop was proposed by Prof. Dr. R R Vasave, while the guest were introduced by the Ishi Sujit Sanjay student of first year B.A. About 70 students of humanities were participated in this program.

The first lecture of workshop was delivered by Dr. R R Vasave . He said in his speech that, "There is no restriction on human behavior, but if you control your own behavior, then crimes like ragging will not happen. He explained about the Concept of Ragging, Consequences of Ragging and the Provision of Anti- Ragging Act and empowering participants with knowledge about their rights and responsibilities. Students were encouraged to take a pledge, against ragging and promote a culture of kindness. He reviewed the recommendations of the Raghav Committee, the directives given by the Supreme Court etc.

The second lecture of the workshop was delivered by the key speaker Dr. M. B. Bachute. Addressing the students, he said, "Ragging is the result of a corrupt mind. Ragging creates a feeling of frustration among students.. Therefore, everyone should be careful that this society is not harmed by ragging. The University Grants Commission established Anti-Ragging in 2018, which explained the laws and the Penal Code. He highlighted the six laws of ragging. On this occasion, he reviewed the various incidents of ragging in the state and gave a fundamental advice that they should take care that there is no problem in getting a job in the future. In the presidential address, Dr. A G Sonawane, Coordinator of the Committee said that "Our constitutions has given rights to the citizens as well as indicated our duties. Ragging is crime, due to ragging, a student is afraid to come to the college and he always remains depressed. As the number of students studying in higher education is increasing day by day, such unpleasant incidents will not happen. Students should be careful."
