

In the northwestern part of the state, particularly Thane, Nashik, Dhule and Nandurbar districts where more 43 percent (43.09) and in the eastern part (Wardha, Nagpur, Bhandara, Chandrapur and Gadchiroli districts), 21.69%, concentration of tribal population to the total tribal population of the state.
